The core is a computer-assisted role-playing between 80 and 200 participants, lasting a day. The game/role play is part of a new educational thinking that promises high academic achievement. Tough Road is developed primarily for secondary education (and partly in Danish, but teachers and other students will translate)</p> <p>Before the game all participants each pulls a lot: One is a farmer and must think long-term to secure his family's future existence. Another operates a global company and a third trying to speculate in commodities in the world market. During the game four cafes will try to sell their freshly made coffee and other refreshments for the players and other needy. All must act and negotiate and "play for life" within tight deadlines.</p>
